We set our C6 a new challenge last season, moving them up to more difficult leagues. These on going weekly sessions enable participants to continue to engage with the Foundation after they finish the course, and allows us to support them in continuing their fitness journey. Our Extra Time programme has welcomed a number of new additions to the group this year, further bolstering the numbers. Our Thursday Night Walking Football League has welcomed additional teams to grow to a league of 12 team, all competing for the league trophy throughout the year.








FOUNDATION PARK SAW AN ESTIMATED FOOTFALL OF 7,442,688 PEOPLE DURING 2022.
